

Two Minute Challenge: Pollution vs. Profit

You are the CEO of a US-based company that specializes in producing high-tech products that are growing rapidly in the market. Your company is experiencing tremendous economic growth, and you received a substantial bonus last quarter as a result of the high profits. One day at work you are informed that rumors are spreading regarding pollution from one of your manufacturing plants. It produces the main components for many of your products and is located in Mexico.

You do some research and find out that no Mexican laws are being broken, but the pollution emitted is higher than suggested in the US and is causing health problems for factory workers and residents in the surrounding community. After talking to other executives, you realize that decreasing the amount of pollution will be very time consuming and costly. This will cause a large drop in profits for the next two periods and potentially your own bonus. What do you do?

Resources	Options
Pollution specialists in both countries	Do nothing; large profits; hurt workers and the surrounding community
Research of other companies within the industry	Find a way to reduce the pollution that might decrease profits in the short run but have substantial long-term benefits
Friends and associates in the company	Call the library for advice
Company code of social responsibility	Ask your boss for guidance

Takeaway Lessons:

1.) Protecting the health of your employees and other stakeholders should hold a much higher precedence over two quarters of financial losses for the business.

2.) You are obligated to follow US regulations, even when your company is not operating within the country and same regulatory code.

3.) A thorough analysis to find more information is always a great first step in complicated situations such as this.
